After the awards, Beacons will work with the Improvement and Development Agency and with each other to develop a co-ordinated programme of theme-specific learning events and peer-support activities.

As reported by Warwick Business School, the Beacon Scheme is best at delivering knowledge and process for improvement, innovation and best practice. Ninety percent of surveyed Beacons reported benefits such as higher national profile, boosting staff morale plus motivating and sustaining further improvement.
